NTU to nurture HR talent from Jakarta

NANYANG Technological University's (NTU) Nanyang Business School (NBS) has forged an unprecedented alliance with the Jakarta city government.

Under the memorandum of understanding (MOU), the Jakarta city government will develop human resource and management talent by enrolling its most promising staff in NBS' prestigious Nanyang Fellows Programme.

The alliance allows both organisations to provide financial aid to students in the form of scholarships by the Nanyang Fellows Programme, the Jakarta capital city government and other scholarships from third-party non-governmental organisations.

Besides this, other aspects of cooperation include developing research in the areas of management and business that are in both parties' interest and benefit.

NBS dean Jitendra V Singh is optimistic about the latest alliance. 'We look forward to contributing to their development as public servants and government leaders, and as they learn from leading management thinkers from both East and West, and forge ties with participants across Asean and Asia in the Nanyang Fellows Programme,' Prof Singh said.

The cooperation agreement between NBS and the Jakarta capital city government is for an initial five years with an option for further extension.
